

Letter to the editor: Undetectable pancreatic insulinoma during surgery

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Dear Editor,

I read with great interest the paper "Undetectable pancreatic insulinoma during surgery" by Kayaalp and et al. (1) from Inonu University Hospital, in which they share their experiences of undetectable pancreatic insulinoma during surgery. Also, the paper gives us comprehensive information about insulinomas and their clinic presentations.

However, I have one comment related to this paper. Although, the authors stated that "magnetic resonance imaging demonstrated a 5 mm lesion in pancreatic corpus" in the manuscript, Figure 1 in the paper belongs to CT image, not MRI. In addition, Figure 1's footnote explains that MRI findings. On the other hand, according to CT images, the pancreatic lesion (the arrow in the image) is in the pancreatic head, not the corpus.

In conclusion, I would like to know the authors comment on these topics that I criticized above.
